

House Rules for the ISS DOME

1. These House Rules apply for the entire inner and outer area of the ISS DOME (hereinafter: premises) in Düsseldorf-Rath for an indefinite period. Access to the premises is permitted exclusively within the scope of these House Rules.
2. They apply for all persons irrespective of what entitles them to be in the area of application of these House Rules.
3. Persons authorised to enter the premises are persons with a valid entrance ticket or another official authorisation pass (respectively for the individual areas shown). Children under the age of 12 are only allowed access if accompanied by a responsible adult. In all cases, the access authorisation is solely for the event stated in the authorisation, and for the period and area stated therein. If necessary for security reasons, the operator/organiser is entitled to allocate the persons places other than those shown in the access authorisation. Persons under the influence of alcohol or narcotics will be refused access. The entrance ticket shall cease to be valid upon leaving the public meeting place.
4. Boxes must not be used by more persons than stated in the box rental agreement.
5. Instructions given by the operator or persons working for him must be followed. This shall also apply for instructions of the organiser as well as for instructions given by persons working for the organiser. Likewise, it is essential that instructions from any public order authorities (e.g. police and fire brigade) be followed. Failure to follow one or more instructions shall result in expulsion from the premises and banning from future entry.
6. When entering the premises, the access authorisation must be shown automatically. Persons as per point 5 of these House Rules have the power to demand presentation of the access authorisation at any time. Inability to produce access authorisation shall result in expulsion from the premises.
7. The taking onto the premises of
 - a) weapons or other dangerous items as well as items which can physically injure people when thrown,
 - b) gas spray cans, caustic or dyeing substances, or pressurised containers for easily inflammable or health-endangering gases, with the exception of normal commercially available pocket lighters,
 - c) containers made from fragile or splintering material,
 - d) bulky items such as ladders, stools, chairs, boxes, suitcases etc.,
 - e) fireworks, rockets, Bengal lights, sparklers, smoke powder, flares and other pyrotechnic items,
 - f) flag or banner poles not made of wood or longer than 1 metre or more than 3 cm in diameter,
 - g) large inscribed banners, double-handle banners, large amounts of paper, rolls of wallpaper,
 - h) mechanically and electrically operated noise instruments,
 - i) food and drink,
 - j) animals (with the exception of working dogs and guide dogs for the blind),
 - k) racist material, anti-foreigner material or other forms of radical or discriminatory propaganda material,
 - l) narcotics
 - m) laser pointers

is forbidden. Contravention shall lead to expulsion from the premises and imposition of a ban on future entry. (exceptions can be allowed by the organiser and hall operator in individual cases).

8. In the event of a person as per point 5 of these House Rules ascertaining incorrect conduct by a person present on the premises, or of suspecting a person of incorrect conduct or a violation of the law, the person as per point 5 is entitled to take the necessary measures (e.g. ascertaining of identity, a search of bags and clothing). Persons as per point 5 of these House Rules are

entitled to make temporary confiscation of items as per point 7 of these House Rules, found on a visitor to the premises.

9. The offering and offering for sale of any form of goods, irrespective of their nature, as well as the distribution of printed matter and/or printed works, is forbidden. Also forbidden is the organisation of any form of collection.
10. The making of film, photographic, tape recorder and/or video recordings or any other form of recording of events and/or of the premises themselves is forbidden, unless the necessary copyright approval has been obtained. If photographs, film and/or video recordings are made on the premises by employees of the public meeting place, by the organiser or authorised companies for the purpose of reporting or for promotional purposes, the recording work must not be hindered or in any other way impaired. All persons entering the premises or present there will be advised of the carrying out of photographic, film or video recordings on the premises by these House Rules. By entering the premises, those persons recognisable on any such recordings consent to the fact that these recordings can be used for both reporting as well as for promotional purposes.
11. Moving around the premises is permitted exclusively within the scope of the respective law of obligations agreement. The parking and leaving of any form of vehicle is permitted exclusively in the spaces provided for this purpose.
12. All persons authorised to enter the premises must conduct themselves such that no other person is endangered, injured or disturbed.
13. All persons authorised to enter the premises must ensure that they do not cause dirtying of the premises in any form whatsoever. All fittings must be treated with due care and attention.
14. Access to the premises is at one's own risk. The operator shall assume no liability whatsoever for items brought in, unless he is responsible for their loss or damage.
15. Passageways and other areas serving the public (in particular escape routes) must be kept clear.
16. Any violation of the House Rules can lead to expulsion from the premises and possibly to the imposition of a ban on future entry.
17. These House Rules shall apply as from the date of commissioning of the premises and can be altered by the operator at any time without stating reasons.

Use of parking spaces and garages

1. Access to and use of the respective parking facilities shall be based on these rules of use.
2. The user hereby declares that he/she will use the parking facilities exclusively within the scope of the law of obligations agreement.
3. Only passenger vehicles in ready-for-operation condition must be parked. If the parking facilities are in an underground car park, the parking of gas-operated vehicles is forbidden. Boats, camping trailers etc. must not be parked.
4. Dirt resulting from parking or driving on the premises must be avoided. In the event of such resulting nevertheless, the operator shall have the dirt removed at the expense of the party causing it.
5. The user must observe the respectively applicable fire prevention regulations. The following is forbidden in particular:
 - a. open fire or light,
 - b. the storage, discharge, filling or refilling of inflammable, combustible or environmentally harmful items/substances such as petrol, oil, acids, varnishes, batteries, old tyres, emptied operating material containers etc.,
 - c. pouring substances as defined above into the drainage system,
 - d. closing, turning off or blocking ventilation devices,
 - e. allowing the engine of the vehicle to run for longer than necessary for entering and leaving,
 - f. parking vehicles giving off environmentally harmful substances such as oil or fuel,
 - g. carrying out repairs or maintenance work to vehicles,
 - h. washing vehicles,
 - i. operating electrical devices,
 - j. altering existing electrical leads.
6. The user must move about the premises with the greatest of care and attention and must constantly pay attention to ensuring that other users are not harmed or disturbed.
7. Travelling about the parking area is at one's own risk; in particular, the operator shall not be liable for the content and load of the vehicles entering.
8. The vehicles must be parked on the marked spaces such that vehicles on neighbouring spaces can be entered and exited at all times without hindrance. Vehicles must not narrow the travelling areas. In the event of failure to observe this requirement, the operator can have the incorrectly parked vehicle brought to the prescribed position at the expense and risk of the user.
9. The road traffic regulations as well as all relevant public order regulations shall apply in addition to these rules of use.
10. These House Rules shall apply as from the date of commissioning of the premises and can be altered by the operator at any time without stating reasons.
